Superior Court of Bergen County, New Jersey, Rejects Parmalat's Claim Against

Citigroup

Parmalat communicates that the jury, sitting in the Superior Court of Bergen County, New

Jersey, has decided not to award damages to Parmalat on its claim against Citigroup for

aiding and abetting breach of fiduciary duty in connection with looting that occurred at

Parmalat prior to December 2003.

Parmalat further communicates that the jury awarded Citibank approximately 364 million

US dollars in connection with counterclaims that it had asserted against Parmalat.

Pursuant to previous rulings of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, this award must be presented

to the Bankruptcy Court in Parma, Italy for review. If admitted, payment should be made in

shares and subject to the ratios applied to claims under the "concordato".

This decision is subject to possible further applications to set aside the verdict in the trial

court, which should be disposed of within a short period of time. If these applications are

denied, Parmalat intends to appeal from the decision as well as from the court's earlier

summary judgment ruling which narrowed the scope of Parmalat's claims.

Parmalat continues to believe that Citigroup played an important role in contributing to the

financial collapse of the Parmalat Group in December 2003, and it will continue to pursue

all legal remedies at its disposal to hold Citigroup accountable for its role, including

through ongoing Italian criminal proceedings.
